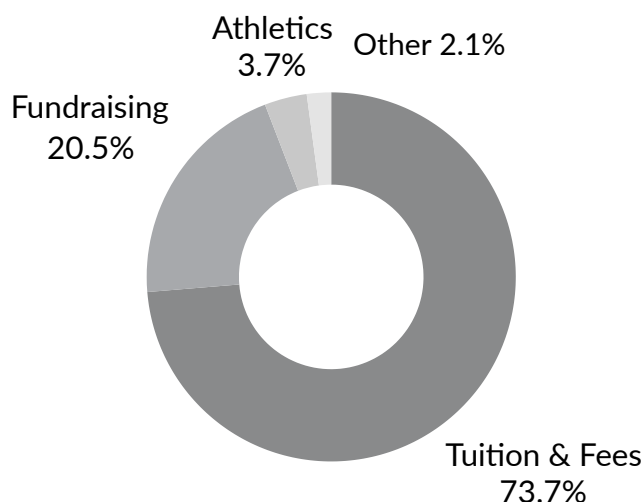

Operating Revenue \$2,678,215



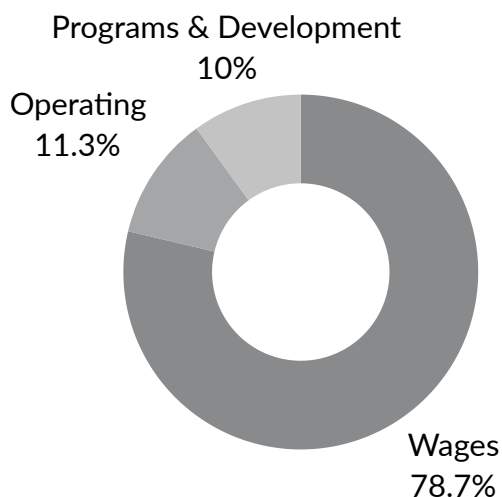

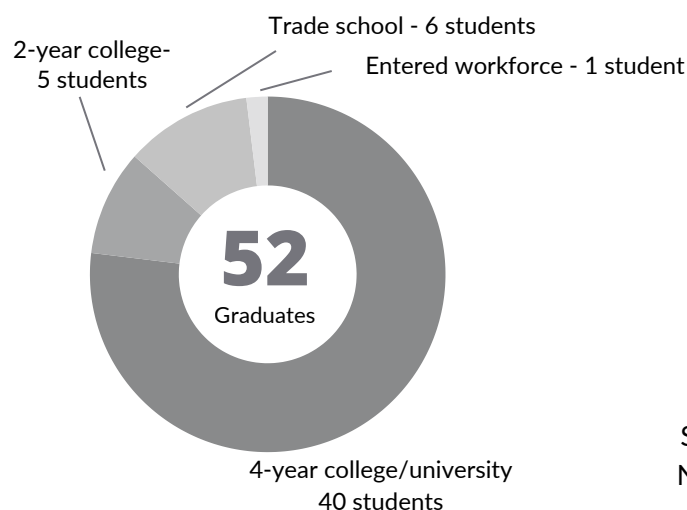

College in the High School

Tri-Cities Prep students have the opportunity to earn college credit through our College in the High School (CiHS) partnership with Central Washington University. This program allows students to receive college credit for the advanced courses they are already taking as part of our curriculum—enabling them to maintain the full high school experience while getting a head start on their college education.

Courses available for college credit during 2024-25 school year:

- Honors Algebra II (CWU Math 152) - 26 students received dual credit
- Honors Psychology (CWU Psychology 101) - 16 students received dual credit

One of the most important aspects of the educational experience at Tri-Cities Prep is our focus on community service. By the time a student graduates, they will have completed at least 140 hours of service, culminating in a senior project focused on serving marginalized individuals in society. The Class of 2025 graduated with over **7,000 hours** of service to the Tri-Cities community over their four years of high school.



Clubs & Activities

At Tri-Cities Prep, students have endless opportunities to explore their passions through a variety of clubs and activities. From Math Club—who brought home top honors at the Washington Student Mathematics Council competition—to Chess Club, Science Olympiad, Red Cross Club, Recycling Club, and more, our students dive into learning, leadership, and service beyond the classroom. Athletics

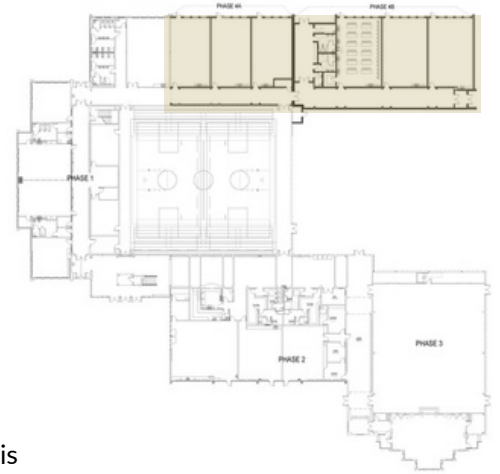


Building a Legacy

On June 3, 2024, Tri-Cities Prep broke ground on Phase IV of the campus, a building expansion adding six new classrooms and additional bathrooms to accommodate our full enrollment. Thanks to the incredible generosity of our supporters, three classrooms were completed in December 2024, allowing us to move two classes out of portables and relocate our "makeshift" classroom from the multi-purpose room. By April 2025, all new classrooms were occupied and will be fully utilized in the 2025–26 school year. In total, more than \$3.4 million in private funds was raised, exceeding our goal and making it possible for every student to learn within the main school building—fostering a more connected, secure, and inspiring environment for our Prep community.

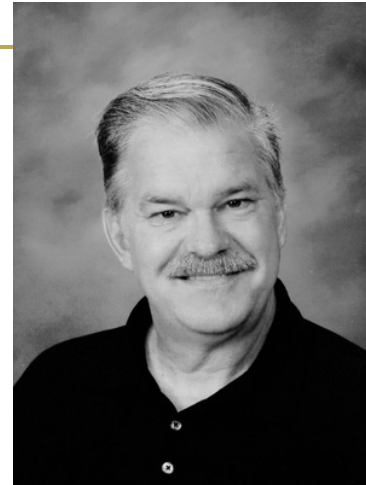
